The painted wall surface in kennels is an important component in the cleaning and sanitation for the kennels. For the paint to hold up against washing and chemicals there are specific processes that you need to go through before you repaint. Epoxy paint must be used. You want the finished wall to be as impervious as possible.

I am assuming that you have concrete masonry block walls. The walls and joints have to be properly cleaned and prepped. That may include repairing damage to the block and/or missing grout. Block filler or a patching compound may be needed. The cleaning must remove old paint, dirt and greasy residue, or other debris build-up on the surface. The walls have to be allowed to dry thoroughly after cleaning. Look at the manufacturers' instructions for length of drying time. If the surface is not dry, there will be moisture behind the new paint and the paint will flake, bubble and fail. Hopefully when your walls were originally constructed, epoxy grout was used. It is moisture resistant. If not then the wall prep is even more important.

A primer should be applied to the clean and dry walls. The paint itself should be epoxy paint. You want the coverage to be thorough so more than one coat may be needed. The paint needs to fill in all the indentions and pinpoints in the block face and grout to achieve the most impervious surface possible.

It would be our recommendation that you hire a professional painter experienced with this type of work. You want a warranty, especially if you are doing a large number of kennels. If the repainting is not done properly and the paint peels, it looks bad. Even worse is that you will not be able to keep the kennels walls properly sanitized. Call me if you want more information. We have a spec we can give you for your facilities maintenance department.
